

## The Story of Smoke Two Joints

Once upon a time on a beautiful island in the Pacific, a rock n reggae band crowded into a small studio and recorded their original song, Smoke Two Joints.

Within days it became the most requested record ever on Hawaiian airwaves. Joints rained down from the crowd whenever The Toyes took the stage. Fans camped outside their homes, hoping for a glimpse of the suddenly iconic band.

On KPOL, Honolulu's top rock station, Smoke Two Joints was #1 every day for 6 solid months.

Tourists brought the single home to their favorite mainland DJs. It became a mainstay on the #1 rock station in LA., and is now #22 on the KROQ alltime top 500.

Smoke Two Joints by The Toyes is the #1 most aired American reggae track of all time, and has a constant presence on AAA, rock and modern rock radio. It has become a cross-format craze wherever it is played. It is also a staple at college, community & reggae radio, and a Dr. Demento classic.

In San Francisco, it is the beloved 'Weekend Salute.' The Bay area's #1 rock station, KFOG, plays it every Friday at 5pm, a tradition that continues to this day. Lots of big stations all over the nation now have similar ritual airings of the 'double doobie,' including KLOS in LA, KSEG and KRXQ in Sacramento, KCAL in San Bernardino, 91X in San Diego, KBAC in Albuquerque, WMMM in Madison, WI, even as far east as Boston's rock WAAF.

The song has been covered by many artists, including Sublime on their multi-platinum "40 Oz. to Freedom" and "Greatest Hits" CDs. It is The Toyes' original version, though, that remains the most aired by far.

To this day, Smoke Two Joints gets regular spins on over 200 stations worldwide, a number which keeps on growing. It's been in several motion pictures, including 'Mall Rats,' 'Homegrown,' 'Grind' and 'The Beach.'
